Eligibility: High School Student minimum 14 years of age & in High Shool

8 classes passed—previous 2 semesters

Fall—all eligible (new student grades need verified)

Spring—Spring of 8th grade and current semester

Equalize Classes

Divide the number of drivers

NW \$50 Lab fee—before your student can drive (student waiver Fr/Re)

(state raised minimum fee to \$250 without

school waiver) Ex. Waverly \$75

Two Parts:

Classroom = 30 clock hours (60 minutes)

B2 Hour 8:53-10:13

Drive = Behind the wheel (minimum 6 clock hours). 11:30 dismiss = TBD

Classroom: 30 clock hours

1st/2nd Quarters

ends approximately -- November 13

3^{rd/}4th Quarters

ends approximately -- April 1

Only three absences of any kind (illness, or school related)

Tardies—I add up the minutes.

4th Day = failure-must start over (permit invalid)

Instruction Permit Application - Name on birth certificate This begins

911 address & PO Box # their driving

Social security number record.

Parent or guardian signature

(whomever signs can cancel)

Handout – to get instruction permit

Permit Application Questions: especially medical form - 3 months prior

Bus to DMV for vision test (glasses, contacts)/\$20 Instruction Permit = 1st license

Can't Hold Bus – Not 15 = go – transport on own with permit app., letter to Carlinville DMV, & certified birth certificate; identification

Permit in Hand = drive with parent or guardian/21 & over with valid license for 1 year that parent approves of and seated in the front seat

Drive Hours: Minimum 6 clock hours—can be more

Parent Teen Driving Guide - provided by the state to help you help your student

Completion of driving with me = driving test

Instruction Permit: 9 months and 1 day from issue date (New style permit)

Good for 24 months from issue date

State's goal is not to get everyone a license by age 16, but to help our young people become safer drivers and not a statistic. The Graduated License Program helped teen driving fatalities drop by 40% from 07-08.

Not all states have Driver Education. Illinois is a leader.

Co-op Test Form (if A or B average)

A or B average = no test unless on spot check

Spot check = driving test if within the 24 months
